September Discussion

It is proposed to have a broad-ranging discussion to identify and prioritize issues for further in-depth examination. Some topics:

- What are the scientific and technical resources of Trust for Nature, and should we seek access to them?
- Should we review our ongoing albeit dated Management Plan, taking the opportunity to re-articulate management objectives and assess the successes – or otherwise – of current practices? All management aspects should be considered, including feral control, weed control, planting program, and monitoring.
- Is there a demonstrated need for a more offensive feral management program?
- How can our fiscal resources be used most effectively? In the past much of the Friends management program appears to have been achieved simply by dint of sheer volunteer effort. Nowadays, management practices increasingly demand the outlay of money, either for modern equipment, or for contracted services. Can we set up benchmarks for measuring the merits of such spending?
- What is the next step for the canopy monitoring?
- Each member will have their own thoughts. Please bring your concerns along to share at the meeting!

Planting

On September 14, seven Friends planted ≈750 plants in the area of the 2024 planting. Recycled fencing panels with netting were installed to expand the 2024 enclosure and exclude wallabies until the plantings are no longer susceptible to browsing. Planted species:

Orford HallSunday October 26

Matthew Hudson is the Principal Hydrogeologist of Southern Rural Water, the agency that regulates and ensures the resilience of groundwater supplies for all of southern Victoria. A major priority for Matt is to seek "... a better understanding of the amount of groundwater that can be taken from each aquifer system without unduly affecting existing users, the environment and Traditional Owner values. This includes how we consider and adapt to climate change."

Subsequent to the presentation attendees are invited to visit Pallister's Reserve – 5 km from Orford – to share a BYO lunch and a walk in a Reserve that includes a rare remaining fragment of the extensive native forests which once covered much of the South-West.
